

Order-Of-Eagles Check Sheet



The Order-of-Eagles is a voluntary awards program. No one is required to participate. Dad and Daughter work together to earn awards for their Order of Eagle necklaces. These fun tasks provide additional opportunities for both of you to share experiences in working, learning, and spending time together.



Use this check sheet and study guide to start building your necklace today!

Bead Color	Tribal Awards: Small Hay-Lush-Ka Beads <i>(Awarded by your tribe Chief or Bead Keeper)</i>	We did it!
PURPLE	Starter: Join Indian Guides	
ORANGE	Program Goals: Memorize and recite the Indian Guides Motto, Pledge & 7 Aims	
GREEN	Campout: Attend a Nation Campout in spring, winter, or fall.	
BLUE	Nature Report: Participate in a Nature Walk and report to your tribe what you saw; Report to your tribe on what you did at a Nation Campout <i>(take a canoe trip, hike in the woods, etc)</i>	
WHITE	Craft: Make or donate property needed by your Tribe; Provide your Tribe's monthly meeting craft project; Make an award for a Nation campout; Make a "significant" craft project and show to Tribe	
BLACK	Songs: Learn the songs 'America' and 'Friends Forever' and sing them for your tribe. <i>Dads - this means you too!</i>	
RED	Meetings: Host a tribal meeting at your house or other special location; Participate in and report on another tribe's meeting or outing; Help your Chief with a Nation event or game.	
PINK	Recruitment: Bring a friend to a tribe meeting; March in a local parade; Promote the program by preparing and distributing recruitment materials; Work in the information booth at a local festival.	
YELLOW	Names: Memorize and recite your tribes' members and Dads real names and Indian Guide names. <i>(Up to 8 pairs for larger tribes.)</i>	

After child and parent have earned all 9 Tribal Awards, they may continue on to the Advanced Awards

Bead Color	Advanced Awards: Large Hay-Lush-Ka Beads <i>(Awarded by the Nation Council of Eagles)</i>	We did it!
DARK RED	Community Service: Organize and/or participate in a community service event. Be prepared to report on the event and answer questions relating to the "who, where, what, why and how" of the event(s) and how your participation made a positive impact on someone else's life.	
DARK BROWN	Nature Report: Collect and be able to identify 10 things from any nature-related groups such as: Trees - Birds - Mammals - Fish - Insects - Planets - Constellations - Rocks - etc. The items can be collected in person, by photograph, by book or internet research.	
TAN	Outdoor Skills: Complete an advanced outdoors skill with minimal adult assistance: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cooking a meal over a campfire • Catching a fish • Starting a fire with a single match using only fire materials found in nature • Learning rope knots • Testing the quality of water in a pond • Complete a second project described under the Nature Report category <i>(These activities do not need to be demonstrated live to the council - pictures are recommended)</i>

Substitutions for Advanced Awards must be approved by the Nation Eagle Leader.

NOTE: All substitutions must be approved in advance of the testing ceremonies.
